## From the Golf Course.....

The Danville Country Club property provides habitat for a diverse list of wildlife species. Our wooded and maintained areas are a virtual wildlife refuge. Raptor birds such as Red-Tail Hawk and American Kestrels nest here and hunt on the property. Red Fox, Wild Turkey, and plenty of White-Tail Deer call us home. Lots of migratory waterfowl pass through and share Lake Melville with our turtles, otters, Blue Herons etc.

I am a member of the Lake Vermilion Water Quality Coalition. This group helps promote practices landowners can employ that favor water quality. Coalition members discuss the health of the lake and propose solutions to some of the challenges.

Yes, we apply fertilizers and pesticides at Danville Country Club golf course. Integrated Pest Management is followed so cultural (non-chemical) practices compliment the chemical applications, often reducing the amount of pesticides required.

One annual application of target-specific insecticide is applied per season on greens and fairways for grub control. That is the extent of our insecticide use.

Fungicides represent the most common application throughout the season. These are applied to living, growing grass.

A very conservative amount of fertilizer is applied in light doses to the greens, tees, and fairways. A rate of less than 100 lbs. of actual nitrogen per acre is used annually on about 30 of our 150 acres. This is applied to a tight cover of living, growing grass that assimilates the application. We even use an organic fertilizer on the greens.
